READING AND WRITING

Keeping up with reading and writing skills over the summer is key to maintaining learning throughout the year — so pay special attention to these creative learning activities.

1. **Read aloud each day:** Even if it's poolside, listen to your child read aloud every day.
2. **Buddy up:** Pick out books for your kids to read together with their friends for fun and a shared experience.
3. **Email friends and family:** Have kids write to friends and family over email to keep in touch while also keeping up with their writing practice.
4. **Read everywhere:** Read street signs, billboards, and anything else you can find while you're on the go this summer.

PLACES TO GO

Going out and getting active is a great way to have fun and learn this summer.

1. **Camping:** Camping offers an excellent opportunity for discussing nature and the world around you.
2. **Go on tours:** Whether it's a chocolate factory or a glassblowing studio, take advantage of tours so kids can learn how everyday items are made.
