Parents' Corner

RSV: When It's More Than Just a Cold

“Almost all children get RSV at least once before they are 2 years old. For most healthy children, RSV is like a cold. But, some children get very sick with RSV. RSV (or respiratory syncytial virus) is one of the many viruses that cause respiratory illness—illnesses of the nose, throat and lungs. This virus usually occurs in the late fall through early spring months, but can vary in different parts of the country. With mask-wearing and physical distancing for COVID-19, there were fewer cases of RSV in 2020. However, once safety measures relaxed with the arrival of COVID-19 vaccines, a rise in RSV cases began in spring 2021. The spread of RSV and other seasonal respiratory illnesses like influenza (flu) has also started earlier than usual this year.”
